

How to Begin Researching Your Family History

Q. How do I start?

A. Ask yourself what you want to accomplish in your genealogy research- know WHY you are doing genealogy. Is it to create a family tree, record family history, have DNA testing, etc.?

Q. Who do I start researching first?

A. Start with yourself, and move back in time. Don't skip generations. Confirm relationships using multiple sources. DO NOT assume everything on the internet or in print is accurate!

Q. How do I keep my research organized?

A. Collect everything you already have. Copy, scan or photograph originals. Use standard forms or a family tree program, and develop a system of record-keeping such as binders for families. Most importantly, record <u>where</u> you found the info (book at library, online records, courthouse, etc.) BACK UP to a flash drive or the cloud often to avoid data loss if your computer crashes.

Q. How do I find personal information that isn't listed in public records?

A. Ask your parents or any living relatives- have a conversation about what they remember. However, family stories may or may not be true- use documents to confirm. Look at family Bibles, scrapbooks or photo albums, etc. One of your relatives may have already started research that you can use.

Q. Are census records important?

A. Yes, the census is the backbone of genealogy. Be sure you know how to read the records/transcripts. Census records from 1790 to 1840 only listed the head of household name. In 1850, each household member's name and place of birth was listed, but it wasn't until 1880 that relationships were listed. Many census records from 1890 were destroyed- use alternate records such as tax rolls, deeds, wills, etc. Records through 1940 are available- the 1950 census will be available in April 2022.

Q. Do I need to pay to research my family history?

A. NO! Utilize your local library (with interlibrary loans to request books and even logins to paid sites), Google, Cyndi's List, or FamilySearch. You can set up a free account on FamilySearch to build your family tree and search records, and a free account on Ancestry will allow you to create a tree, but many records are only accessible through paid subscriptions.

Q. Should I join a genealogical or historical society (local or online)?

A. Yes, joining for a small membership fee will give you access to info in the area you are researching, and assistance from members. There are also genealogical groups and pages on Facebook, and people or organizations on Instagram, Pinterest or Twitter to follow. Sometimes simply posting a question will connect you with someone who's done research on the person you are researching!

Q. Is there a "quick" way to research my family history?

A. Unfortunately, no. Some companies advertise that you can discover many generations with just the click of a mouse on a website, but each ancestor must be carefully researched to avoid errors. Genealogy research can be time-consuming, but very rewarding when you are able to share your family's history with your family and other researchers.


